

Apprentice Plumber Position

Job Overview

The Apprentice Plumber plays a key role in supporting Journeymen and Master Plumbers with various plumbing tasks required for each job. After receiving instruction, the Apprentice should be able to perform minor plumbing tasks independently. Work environments include both interior and exterior settings in residential and commercial properties, addressing customer needs that may range from simple repairs and component replacements to large facility installations.

Primary Responsibilities

- Assist Journeymen and Master Plumbers in completing plumbing work as required.
- Independently perform minor plumbing tasks after proper instruction.
- Conduct a variety of plumbing operations in both residential and commercial environments, including interior and exterior settings.
- Work both independently and within a team environment.
- Interact professionally with customers, vendors, and other employees.
- Maintain safe working practices that consider the safety of oneself, coworkers, and the public.
- Perform tasks including, but not limited to:
 - Moving and preparing materials and fixtures for installation
 - o Installing piping, fittings, and accessories
 - o General clean-up duties
 - Other tasks as assigned

Drive company vehicles as needed to meet worksite requirements.

Maintain neat and orderly work practices, with attention to basic plumbing principles.

Qualifications and Requirements

- Ability to crawl, walk, bend, stoop, and stand to complete assigned tasks.
- Ability to safely use ladders.
- Maintain a neat appearance at all times.
- Listen attentively to detailed instructions from team members and supervisors.
- Demonstrate good communication skills and the ability to collaborate in a team setting.
- Exhibit punctual attendance at both the shop and job sites.
- Have a basic understanding of plumbing principles and a willingness to continue learning.
- Ability to read and utilize tape measures, levels, and other common plumbing tools.
- Willingness to pursue Journeymen licensing.
- Capability to routinely lift and move up to 70 lbs.
- Hold a valid driver's license with a clean driving record.
- Familiarity with MO-OSHA safety requirements.
- Ability to safely operate hand and power tools.
